


ORGANIZATION STRUCTURE





2023 ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE



In December we participated in the Prince George County Christmas parade. The parade theme was "Christmas Greetings" and we decorated our float with a stable with Mary, Joseph, baby Jesus and some stable animals. We had angels on one end and shepherds on the other declaring the Christmas greetings of "Glory to God in the highest!" and "Good News, Great Joy!". We also had children handing out bags of candy with promotional material for our Christmas Night of Worship. It was a great time of fellowship and relationship building having families come together to work on the float.

In March, we took our 5th/6th graders out for a night of worship in Midlothian to see Phil Wickham

In April we hosted EASTER in Five Letters which is an evangelical community event that walks through the last week of Jesus' life. It was a great time for families to come together to talk through the events leading up to Jesus's crucifixion and to share with their children why these events are so important. We had about 15 families attend and look forward to hosting again next year.

We ended our WOL year in June with our annual pool party and awards celebration. We had 21 children, and 2 leaders complete the requirements for Gold this year and 1 earn her Steadfast award!

We also attended Centrikid camp in June which was awesome after not attending the past 3 years. We had 9 children, 3 leaders and 1 Teen Assistant attend including one young man who lives in Northern VA who joined us last minute because of his cousin sharing his excitement about camp. God made a way for him to come and he was saved at camp! Not only that, but God provided contacts at camp for a church that is 15 minutes from his house and his family has been attending there on a regular basis. Praise the Lord! Our Teen Assistant also felt a calling to a full-time staffer position with Centrikid next summer! We are praying now for more children to be able to attend next year!

Vacation Bible School was a resounding success this year! We went with a new publisher, Answers in Genesis, and were very happy with the strong biblical content and Gospel emphasis. We averaged 130 in attendance throughout the week and had 4 confirmed decisions. During the missions rotation, we packed 132 shoeboxes and we exceeded our goal of \$1,000 collected during the offering each night to cover the cost of shipping those boxes. There were 4 confirmed salvation decisions during VBS and we continue to see families joining Unity as a result of VBS. Our Sunday night attendance has grown by 40% and we are excited to see these kids come to know Jesus as Savior and grow in their walk with Him!

In August, we hosted a back-to-school prayer event for our kids. We had 9 stations for them to visit encouraging them to pray for school leaders, fears and worries, to be committed to hard work, friendships, temptations, being a light in their schools and being set apart sharing God's love throughout the school year. It was a great opportunity to encourage prayer in all areas of life and help them focus on God as they started the school year.

The 3rd Sunday of each month, we helped the missions team by packing back packs of food to be distributed to children in need at each of our local elementary schools.

Through October, we have had 5 children come forward with public professions of faith, following through with baptism.


Please keep in mind that we are going to need carpet in the main building. It is very worn and cleaning is not making it look much better.

Unity At Glance 2022-2023

- Women's Ministry Kickoff took place on October 7: Girlfriends & Gratitude. It was a great success. Worship, testimony, prayers, and games were in the program along with a great buffet.
- In the late winter of 2009, the first **Good News Clubs** (GNC) started at L. L. Beazley Elementary. GNC is a weekly Christian program for children 5-12 years old featuring a Bible lesson, songs, memory verses, and games. The Good News Club Outreach quickly grew to all five elementary schools in Prince George. The last one was the new school on Middle Road. They reach 277 children each week, and 40% of the children are totally unsaved. In 2022-2023, 27 professions of faith took place through Good News Club.
- Small groups are growing. And we are in the home stretch with finishing the modulars. We are
 excited to create more rooms for additional groups to go deeper with Jesus! The floors are
 installed and so are the doors, inside lighting, AC/heat... And finally, after two years, we now
 have access to county water! More than ever, we are still in need of help finalizing them as
 soon as possible. All skill levels are welcome!
- The Youth Ministry served Special Olympics at Camp Kehukee in September.
- See You at the Pole™ took place the fourth Wednesday of September and the number of students were on the rise. It is simply a prayer rally where students meet at the school flagpole before school to lift their friends, families, teachers, school, and nation to God. See You at the Pole™ is a student-initiated, student-organized, and student-led event.
- Oakland Baptist Church of Disputanta and Unity provided Pop tarts for PGHS Students when they
 returned to school via PGHS FCA.
- Some of our youth tech/worship had an amazing day at Liberty University for the Worship and Technology Conference where they learn more about enhancing their skills, finding solutions, and learning new ideas for our church's worship and technology ministries.
- SpringFest 2023 was such a blast! We had so much fun and got to connect with a lot of folks in our community. Pray that the Lord would use that touch for His glory and that we as a church family would continue to shine His light in our community.
- Pastor David, our youth pastor transitioned to his new role as a Word of Life missionary in April.
 And we are so glad that he and his family are staying at Unity. We are still looking for a Youth
 Pastor.
- EASTER in 5 LETTERS was a great success. This was a self-paced and self-guided event. Families
 walked with Jesus through His last days and hours before the cross and then celebrated His
 resurrection.
- The **Hospitality Team** had the opportunity to host the **Fishers of Men** before their tournament on March 17 for the second year.
