

2025 ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE



2025 has been a year full of things to celebrate within the worship and media ministries, but it has also been a year of unexpected twists and turns. God has been with us the entire way, and He alone deserves the glory! Below, you'll find more details about the things to celebrate and the unexpected events that unfolded throughout the year. I wanted to give a special shout out to our media team leader Anthoni Bobeau, online service team leader Billy Walker, and numerous other team leaders for jumping in and helping me in the recovery process from the lightning strike that occurred in July.

Message from the Minister

This year was truly special. We witnessed God move in the hearts of many students, and it has been deeply encouraging to see younger students begin to take ownership of their faith. Our youth team made a concerted effort to constantly seek ways to improve our processes, which led to several meaningful changes over the past year. These changes helped us place a greater emphasis on discipleship while still keeping a strong heart for reaching the lost. Many of the things God accomplished through the ministry this year are listed below, though it would be impossible to capture all He has done.

Youth Ministry Highlights — 2025

- Interior Modular Rehab Completed Our newly renovated worship space has become an exciting place where teens love to gather, worship God, and invite their friends.
- Christian Service Opportunities Participated in community service projects during the spring, including Night to Shine.
- Partnership with West End Christian School Basketball Built relationships with players and coaches, and shared intentional time on a senior retreat.
- Afterparty Nights Continued hosting themed nights such as Western Night, Super Bowl Party, and Mini Golf Night. These events created fun, welcoming environments where students could invite friends and hear about Jesus.
- FCA Huddle Prince George JV Baseball Launched a new Fellowship of Christian Athletes huddle, providing consistent spiritual encouragement and support.
- Word of Life Student Camp (New York) Many students grew closer together and took next steps in their faith during this transformative week.
- Expanded Student Volunteer Opportunities Students served in Sports Camp, the Greeter Team, Good News Clubs, and many other areas of ministry.
- Record VBS Attendance Our Vacation Bible School saw record-breaking attendance! Students
 invited friends to learn the Good News, play games, and deepen their faith. At least two students
 made professions of faith in Christ.
- Growing FCA Presence Helped establish a new in-school FCA club at Moore Middle School and strengthened existing partnerships.
- On-Campus Outreach Engaged students through school lunches, clubs, and FCA meetings.
- FCA JV Football Partnership Continued serving the football team with weekly chapels focused
 on living a Christian life. We encouraged several students through injuries and developed
 relationships with a new coaching staff.
- See You at the Pole Assisted with See You at the Pole events across all three Prince George schools.
- West End Christian School Chapels Held weekly chapel services for grades 6–12, encouraging students to grow in their walk with Christ.
- Thursday Night Evangelistic Services Hosted themed outreach events such as Laser Tag Night,
 Line Dancing Night, and Carnival Night to reach students in fun, gospel-centered ways.
- Increased Small Group Accountability Set clear discipleship goals and group incentives in areas like quiet time, Scripture memory, and evangelism, following Word of Life core values.

- Student Trips and Activities Organized trips to Liberty University, Busch Gardens, Swaders, Scaremare, and more.
- Baptisms Celebrated the baptism of 8 students since the last business meeting.
- Volunteer Growth Expanded our Student Ministry volunteer team from 4 to 9 members.

- Plan evangelistic opportunities such as Open Air Evangelism Days to help students grow in boldness.
- Continue Afterparty and outreach nights to reach the lost.
- Create new opportunities for students to serve within the church and lead their peers.
- Strengthen FCA presence on local campuses, with a special focus on growing the Moore Middle School club.

We had a great time at our second annual Gingerbread Bash with over 40 attending. Gingerbread Bash is a fun Christmas tradition to help kids experience the true meaning of Christmas through gingerbread nativities, Bible stories, songs and games. This is such a great family event and will quickly become a new family tradition for Christmas.

In March we hosted a WOL FASCAR Rally with over 50 in attendance. FASCAR is a racing themed family outreach event that combines matchbox cars and competition into one amazing event. Families had a great time racing matchbox cars, even adults participated. Our WOL missionary David Pinkham shared a Gospel presentation with the group.

In April we hosted EASTER in 5 Letters, this is a self-paced interactive, family-friendly event designed to teach about the final days of Jesus' life, spelling out the name "J-E-S-U-S" through various stations that represent events from the Triumphal Entry to the Resurrection. We had about 25 people attend this year.

Kids in the ministry attended a bowling night at Hopewell Bowling Alley and had an awesome time of fellowship.

We ended our WOL year in June with our annual pool party and awards celebration. We had 24 children, and 5 leaders complete the requirements for Gold this year!

June is also kids camp month and we returned to Eagle Eyrie for Centrikid camp. Nineteen kids and 4 leaders attended where we spent the week diving deep into God's Word with daily themes of "Higher Love, Higher Life, and Higher Command," to support the main message.

We were blessed to have Sarah Fink as our Kids Ministry summer intern leading Bible Bootcamp on Sunday nights throughout the summer. She hosted many themed nights, a family movie night and was one of our MC's for vacation bible school.

Vacation Bible School was a resounding success this year! We used Answers In Genesis curriculum again this year, and were very happy with the strong biblical content and Gospel emphasis. We averaged 168 in attendance throughout the week and had 4 confirmed decisions. During the missions rotation, we packed 143 shoeboxes and collected over \$2,000 towards the shipping goal. Because of those extra donations, we were able to fill another 25 shoeboxes.

We kicked off our WOL year with a Nerf night, the kids had a blast playing multiple nerf related games in the field.

Through October, we have had 2 children come forward with public professions of faith, following through with baptism.

This year the WOL leaders started a monthly prayer meeting. We come together the 4th Sunday of each month before WOL to pray for the kids in our ministry, our church leadership, families in the church and for the ministries in the church.

- Continue partnership with youth leadership to identify transition opportunities for 6th graders to youth ministry



2025 Business Meeting Report

Discipleship Groups provide individuals with opportunities to build stronger relationships with Christ by connecting with one another. This is done through Bible-based teaching, supporting one another in prayer, and various opportunities to connect and serve outside of Sunday morning attendance.

Involvement in these groups is also a key measure of a healthy church. According to a recent study by the Lifeway organization, protestant churches average 44% of their attendees also attending small groups.¹ Here at Unity, we are thankful to have an average small group participation rate of 60% for the 2025 calendar year to date. Our small group attendance ranged from 131 to 187 individuals. These weekly numbers are reflected in graph below (January through October 2025).



There is a present need for more adults willing to grow as small group leaders over various age groups. Speak with your current group leader, or with Brian Perkins if interested. We will discuss your interests and strengths, where Unity's needs are, and who you may best connect with to be involved.

For the 2026 calendar year, we will continue to faithfully grow and mature our discipleship groups. This will be done through encouraging each group leader to individually disciple future leaders, being intentional about promoting participation in relevant trainings and conferences that serve our area, and ensuring all classrooms have the resources to sustain effective ministry.

Opening Reflection

We gathered in laughter and in tears, carried one another through sickness and celebration, and watched God shape ordinary faithfulness into extraordinary fruit. Every van ride, meal delivered, and late-night prayer is woven into a single story of a church learning again what it means to love God and love our neighbor. Our hearts overflow with gratitude.

Worship and Milestones

Easter rose like a sunrise: three worship services alive with thanksgiving as families and visitors filled the sanctuary to celebrate the resurrection. Later, our 25th Anniversary humbled and encouraged us—one unified worship service followed by a warm luncheon, a prayer walk across the grounds, and the signing of a renewed covenant. That day held memory and promise, honoring those who planted Unity and blessing the generations called to carry it forward.

Children, Families, and Formation

Van Ministry: Faithful drivers, chaperones, and prayer partners extend a warm welcome to neighborhood children, inviting them into a community where every child matters. Each new face reminds us of the true purpose behind our service—a heart for belonging and love.

Good News Club: Through engaging stories about Joseph and Daniel, children learned to pray simply and sincerely. Thanks to dedicated volunteers, the Good News Club now reaches every elementary school in Prince George, planting seeds of faith across our community.

Homeschool "Branches": Launched in August 2025, this vibrant initiative creates a space where education and discipleship flourish side by side. The "Branches" community is growing, offering families support and connection as they pursue learning rooted in faith.

Children's Ministry: Led by Tammy Bobeau, our Sunday School and Children's Church provide thoughtful, age-appropriate programming. By intentionally supporting rising sixth graders during transitions, we foster a nurturing environment where children can thrive and grow spiritually.

English as a Second Language (ESL) classes are an important part of our church's outreach, offering a welcoming place for individuals and families to improve their English, build confidence, and connect through Christian fellowship. These sessions support newcomers with language instruction, friendships, guidance, childcare, and transportation. The ESL ministry embodies Unity's mission of loving God and neighbor by meeting practical needs and fostering community.

Youth: Space, Soul, and Service

Youth Modular Transformation: Our youth now enjoy a revitalized modular space featuring an expanded stage, upgraded sound system, a convenient kitchenette, and fully accessible restrooms—all clear signs that our young people are deeply valued here.

Leadership — Cody Parrish, Youth Pastor: Under Cody's welcoming, Gospel-focused guidance, our youth ministry flourished with dynamic midweek outreach events, engaging afterparties, a JV Baseball FCA huddle, a domestic mission project, Student Summer Camp, and Trail Days, which drew 19 participants. We are grateful to Cody, our dedicated volunteers, and supportive parents for their unwavering investment in the next generation.

Formation: Through retreats, small groups, and leadership development sessions, students were equipped and empowered for peer discipleship and meaningful service.

Outreach: Service that Speaks of Christ

Our commitment to community partnerships was evident throughout the year. We were honored to host the Youth Public Safety Academy Graduation in collaboration with the Prince George Fire Department, celebrating young leaders with our neighbors. Each month, our partnership with the **American Red Cross** brought life-saving blood drives to our campus, connecting us to urgent needs beyond our walls. Through the **Baby Bottle Campaign**, we joined hands with life-affirming ministries, extending hope and practical support to families in need.

This spirit of service was mirrored by **Troop 902's Eagle Scout Project in Prince George**. The troop rallied together, raising \$1,000 and generously donating \$300 back to our church. Their hard work transformed the *Unity Peace Garden*: a new cross stands at its heart, a tiled path leads the way, benches offer space to rest, and fresh landscaping welcomes all. This renewed garden now serves as a tranquil place for prayer and quiet reflection, blessing our congregation and community alike. An additional six benches were constructed.

Our **Ladies Outreach** and seasonal ministries continued to pour tangible care into the community. Christmas cookies baked with love, backpacks filled for students, and care packages sent to college students—all these efforts carried encouragement and connection to those near and far.

In **Missions**, our reach grew wider. **Trail Days** expanded, sending a team on a second out-of-state trip, while partnerships with *Evergrace* Church Plant and support for an **Appalachian Vacation Bible School** allowed us to serve alongside others in new places. A four-week missions study deepened our understanding and commitment, ensuring our hands-on service was rooted in thoughtful practice and a shared sense of purpose.

Practical Ministries and Service Rhythm

Our monthly **Blood Drives** remained a vital lifeline for the community, providing life-saving outreach and fostering meaningful connections beyond our church walls. The **Van Ministry** and **Good News Club** played a crucial role in reaching children, ensuring they were cared for and supported on a personal level.
